# Dear Spooky supporter,

Welcome to the first show of my first full season as Spooky Action's new artistic director. It's an honor to be the first immigrant woman to run this theater, and it's a responsibility I don't take lightly. As Newton Moreno's **Agreste (Drylands)** astutely observes, "sometimes it takes great courage to take the first step."

My life's journey has been irrevocably marked by border crossings. When I decided to title the season "Beyond Borders," I was stating a naive but impassioned aspiration for the future: a vision for a world made limitless through art. This season's plays inspired me to think about borders more broadly, to ask: what are the territories of the mind and heart that we guard the most fervently? This season explores the lines we draw, not just between countries or cultures, but between belief systems, aesthetics, identities. Our season celebrates the power of theater to dissolve artificial boundaries through empathy and imagination, and to build bridges instead.

I envision the new Spooky Action as an incubator for global visions, bold aesthetics, urgent conversations, and passion projects. So it meant the world when Danilo Gambini approached me with his translation of Agreste - a new Brazilian queer classic about love and intolerance. Upon its premiere in 2004, the play, which is based on real events, shocked the conscience of its audience as one of the first theater works to openly condemn bigotry in Brazil. I have followed Danilo's work with curiosity since our time at the Yale School of Drama because the scale of his theatrical ambition is only matched by the generosity, with which he invites collaborators and audiences into his process.

Under his confident direction, **Agreste** is a communal exorcism of our worst impulses, so that we may never repeat them. But it is also a celebration of love - the kind of love that leaps over fences, brings rain to the drylands, challenges the status quo, and leaves us forever changed.

# **PLAYWRIGHT**



**Newton Moreno** was born in Recife, Brazil, and holds a Performing Arts bachelor's degree from Universidade Estadual de Campinas (Unicamp), and both Master and Doctoral degrees from Universidade de São Paulo (USP). He taught at ELT (Escola Livre de Teatro de Santo André) and at São Paulo School of Drama (SP Escola de Teatro), chairing their Playwriting programs. He participated as an actor and director in several plays, and in 2001 he staged his first text, *Deus sabia de tudo e.../God knew all about it and....* Since then he has written many other plays, including *Agreste/Drylands*, which won several awards in 2004, including the APCA and the Shell Award, the two most important awards in Brazil. *Agreste* was also performed in London, Mexico City and Buenos Aires. His most recent play, *Sueño*, is currently playing in São Paulo, Brasil.

**Danilo Gambini** (he/him) (Translator/Director) is a director, writer, and producer, originally from São Paulo, Brazil. He is currently the Associate Artistic Director at Studio Theatre. Upcoming productions include the opera *The Rake's Progress*, by Igor Stravinsky, at Yale Opera in 2024. His recent directing credits include the world premieres of *Ni Mi Madre* (Rattlestick Theater/OBIE Award Winner, Drama Desk Nom., New York Times Critics Pick), and the musical *Sabina* (Portland Stage Maine, co-directed with Daniella Topol). Other credits include *Fun Home, The Tempest, Rock Egg Spoon* (Yale School of Drama), *Agreste* (*Drylands*), *Bakkhai, The Swallow and the Tomcat, Truck* (Yale Cabaret). Opera credits include *Don Giovanni, Ariadne Auf Naxos, Eugene* 

Onegin (Theatro São Pedro). Before Studio Theatre, he was the Associate Artistic Director at New York's Rattlestick Theater, Co-Artistic Director at Yale Summer Cabaret, and a member of Roundabout Director's Group.
